



Accessing the Tx Plans Tab via the Restorative Chart

Step 1


From the main Denticon window, click **Scheduler** in the toolbar.



There are two ways to access the Restorative Chart:


Option 1

Select the patient's **appointment** and click on the **Restorative Chart** icon from the toolbar.




Option 2

Right-click on the **appointment**, hover over **Go To** and select **Restorative Chart**.



Select the **Tx Plans** tab.

Note: There are three tabs in the Restorative Chart: Pre-existing, Completed and Tx Plans. They all display information graphically. When a tab is selected, items in that tab will be listed at the bottom of the screen in the details section and displayed in specific colors. In this example, items in the Pre-existing tab are blue; items in the Completed tab are green; and Tx Plan items are red.




The Tx Plans tab is now open within the Restorative Chart, displaying the patient dashboard at the top, the interactive tooth chart in the middle, and a detailed record of treatment planned items below displayed in red.

Navigating the Tx Plans Tab

Viewing Conditions and Procedures

From the Restorative Chart, click the **Tx Plans** tab to view pre-existing conditions, completed procedures and treatment planned services on the tooth chart.




Viewing Tooth Information

There are two viewing options for tooth information:

Option 1: Quick **Tooth Information**

Hover over the charted area of a tooth to view the most recent information about it.




Option 2: Detailed Tooth Information

Step 1

To view detailed information about a tooth, select a tooth then click **Tooth History**.


Note: The Tooth History button will activate after a tooth has been selected.

Note: The Change Dentition and Last Selection buttons are unavailable when the Tx Plans tab is selected.




Step 2

Choose a **tab** from the pop-up to view: All information about a tooth; only Pre-Existing information; Ledger items; TxPlan; or Progress Notes.



Step 3


Click Clear Selection to deselect the tooth and deactivate the Tooth History button.



Viewing Patient Insurance Benefits

Step 1

From the patient's dashboard above the Restorative Chart, click the **blue hyperlink** for Primary or Secondary Insurance.




Step 2

In the pop-out window, click the **Benefits** tab to view the patient's Individual Maximum and Deductible, as well as notes about services. This tab also shows whether the Insurance Plan downgrades any services, if the crowns are to be paid for on the prep or seat date, orthodontic maximums and predetermination requirements.

Step 3

The Coverage and Limitation tab will provide information about the deductible applying, coverage percentage, frequency, any age limits as well as waiting periods.




Charting a Filling

Step 1

From the Tx Plans tab, select the affected surfaces on the tooth chart, then click Restoration.




Choose the appropriate material.




Step 3

Based on the tooth surfaces and material selected, an appropriate procedure code must be selected via the Add ADA Code pop-out window.



Click **Add Procedure** to enable the system to automatically move onto the next selected tooth.

Note: Automatically moving onto the next tooth is only relevant if more than one tooth is being charted at the same time.



A filling has now been charted and displayed on the tooth chart.

Charting an Extraction and an Implant


Step 1

From the **Tx Plans** tab, click on the pink area to select an entire tooth.

Step 2


Click Extraction.

Note: The Implant button under the Tx Plans tab will be disabled until the tooth is marked as missing or planned for extraction.




Step 3

In the Add ADA Code pop-out window, select the appropriate procedure code, then click Add Procedure.




Step 4

To activate the Implant button, select the entire tooth again by clicking the **pink area**.




Step 5

Click Implant, then choose an Implant Post.




Step 6

In the Add ADA Code pop-out window, select the appropriate **procedure code**, then click **Add Procedure**.




To follow-up the Implant with a Custom Abutment and an Implant Crown, select the **entire tooth**, then click **Implant**.




Step 8

Click Implant Crown.

Note: To chart an Implant Crown, the Implant Post must already be documented.



In the Add ADA Code pop-out window, select the **procedure code** for a Custom Abutment, then click **Add Procedure**. Repeat Steps 7 to 9 to chart an Implant Crown.




An Implant has now been charted on the tooth chart, followed-up by a Custom Abutment and an Implant Crown.


Charting Unlisted Services and using Explosion Codes

Step 1

From the Tx Plans tab, click ADA Codes to access procedures that are not listed in the selection boxes on the right hand side of the screen.




Use the **Explosion Code** dropdown to select the **code** that matches the service(s), then click **Go**.



Type the tooth number into the field, or click the V to choose a tooth number for the Procedure Code.


Step 4

Click Save.



Note: If all services are tied to the same

tooth, the remaining tooth number fields can be automatically populated.



The unlisted services have now been charted on the tooth chart, and are listed in the details section.
